Dear Edina School Parent:

Thank you for this opportunity to explain the emergency medical services and fees provided by the City of Edina.

SERVICES

The Edina Fire Department Paramedics will, along with the Edina Police, provide to your child on-scene emergency medical treatment and ambulance transportation to area hospitals as requested via "911".

Upon arrival, the Paramedics will assess and treat your child per Standard Operating Procedures. Then, if needed, we will transport your child to the hospital you have indicated on the "Hospital in Case of Emergency" line of the Health Information Form on file with the school health associate. However, if it is a life-threatening situation, your child will be transported to the most appropriate hospital as determined by the Paramedics.

FEES (2017 rates – Rates for 2018 to be determined by City Council):

On Scene Treatment with no transport.....	(no charge)
Medications Administered with no transport.....	\$474.00
Basic Life Support/Minor Care.....	\$1,627.00
Advanced Life Support I/Moderate Care.....	\$1,627.00
Advanced Life Support II/Major Care.....	\$2,070.00
Mileage (from scene to hospital).....	\$25.00/mile
Additional Staffing or Mechanical Extrication.....	\$697.00

Occasionally, due to other emergency responses, our ambulance service may not be available. In that case, a neighboring ambulance service will be immediately dispatched, (and any fees would be billed thru that ambulance service).

I hope this information clarifies our services and explains the request for "Hospital in Case of Emergency" on the Health Information Form, should your child require medical attention. Should you have any questions, please call me at 952-826-0332.
